

Dear Master Pattern:

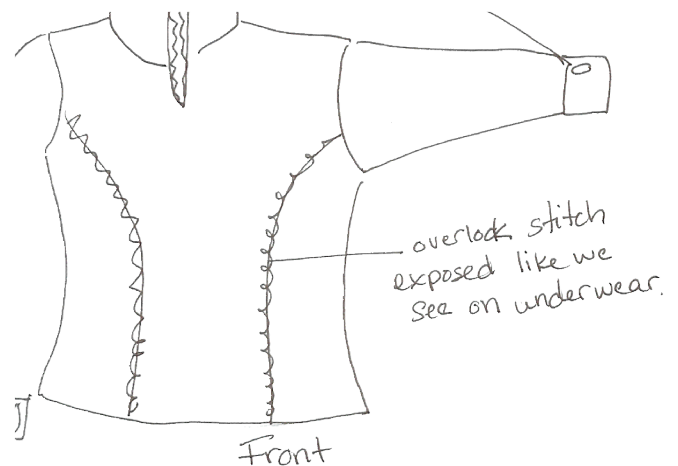

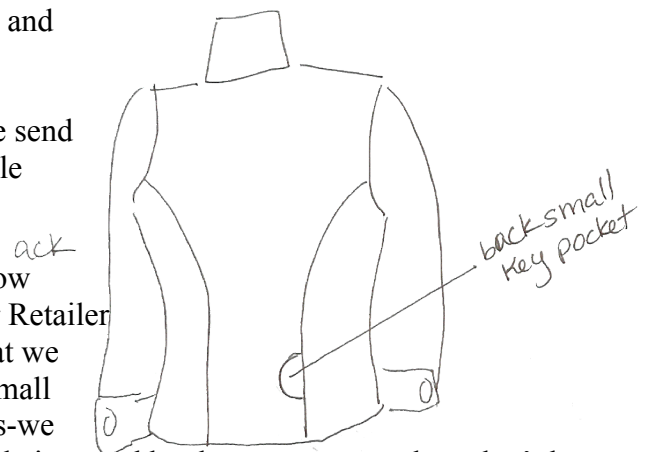

- a women's long sleeve pullover
- sizes will be XS – XXL and the size we want to start with is a Medium
- close to the body (it won't be worn over a shirt)
- the zip is about 9" but tell us if this works
- we want the collar to be about 2" high
- we like the shaped seams in the front and back—are these called princess seams...? We don't want the fit baggy and the woman is curvy.
- The fabric we want is very stretchy—if we send you some can you sew one for us?
- Our special features include thumb holes in a longer cuff so that the cuff can act like a mitt to keep the hand warm
- We also want a very small pocket on the back shaped seam on the right side
- We want the shaped seams in front and back to be sewn in the stitch that looks flat like we see in undergarments and activewear—what is this called and can most factories do this?



We have a couple shirts that we like the fit of. If we send them to you do you have to take them apart to be able to use them?

Also, how long will this project take and do you know where we can buy the zippers. We went to Outdoor Retailer to find our fabrics and we think we finally have what we want from someone who is willing to work with a small company. And, do we have to use computer patterns—we want to be able to use our patterns when they aren't being used by the contractor and we don't have that kind of software or know how to use it.
